A MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL

At a special council meeting last night, Council voted to take a longer-term view when assessing the reopening of parking for hikers seeking to access trails. Current measures to limit the number of hikers on trails in and around the village will remain in place.

The decision will be reassessed at regular Council meetings beginning on Tuesday next week.

In accordance with the resolution, "Council will review relevant available data and professional opinions in consideration of reversing the closure of parking used to access the trails surrounding the Village of Lions Bay."

UPDATES FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS YARD

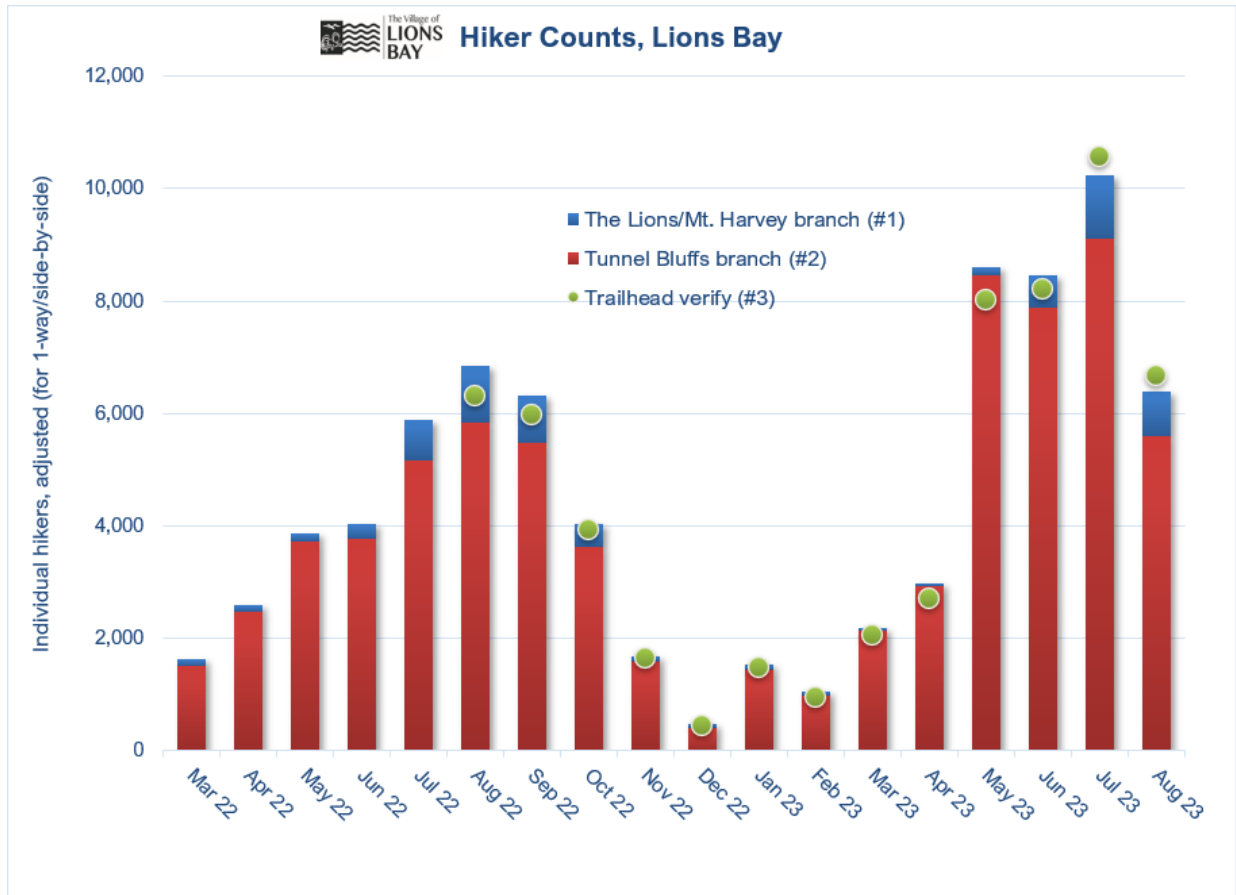


With parking zones recently temporarily rejiggered, a reminder that Resident Permit Decals may be used to park anywhere in the Village that does not have a No Parking/Stopping signage, not within five meters of a fire hydrant, not in a cul-de-sac, and not in the Lions Bay Beach Park pay lot (Lions Bay Ave. is all Permit Required parking to compensate). Pay lots at Sunset Trailhead and Kelvin Grove Beach Park and FlowBird virtual pay areas, are open to Resident Parking decals too. Resident Parking decals may also *temporarily* park in zones currently signed No Parking - previously pay parking. Residents may request unlimited free Guest Permits, which are printed on copy-proof paper and good until noon the next day.

Contractor Permits are good for three months to park in any Permit Required zone. Lions Bay Marina is private.

“Annual Permit” street signage has the same force and effect as “Resident Permit” and is being trialled in areas where the latter seems to cause resentment or pushback.

We see the impact of one weekend of smoke, half a weekend of rain and one weekend of trailhead parking closure on August’s trail user counts:
