NEW ANNUAL PARKING PASS



The new Annual Parking Pass will be mailed out with the **2024 Utility Notice** scheduled for later April. Make sure to watch for them.

SOME THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND:

- Each household will be issued two '2' passes free of charge.
- Extra passes are \$40 each and are not pro-rated.
- Annual passes for secondary suites are the responsibility of the owner. Extra passes may need to be purchased.
- The old purple pass which expires on March 31, 2024, will be honoured until July 31, 2024. This extended graceperiod is to accommodate Canada Post delivery, as well as the new expiry date moving forward. Please take note of it.
- Lost, stolen, damaged passes may be replaced, but are subject to the \$40 replacement charge depending on the circumstances.
- Passes are intended for residents only. Proof of residency will be required when requesting passes.


IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE FINANCE DEPARTMENT

Dates to Watch For...

- ⇒ 2024 Utility Notices will be mail out end of April
- ⇒ Property Taxes, will be issued no less than 6 weeks prior to due date of July 14, 2024.

Ways to Pay...Please note changes below:

- Cash Payments: effective immediately, cash payments will be limited to \$150.00 only. The Village Office will only accept secure forms of payment.
- Cheques, Personal cheques are accepted. NSF fees will apply in the event of insufficient funds.
- Money Orders, Bank Drafts issued by your financial institution
- Debit Card in person (be sure to check your daily limits)

As residents of Lions Bay, we take great pride of our commitment to waste reduction and recycling efforts whenever possible. It's important for us to emphasize the correct sorting of materials.



Glass is 100% recyclable and can be reused over and over again. However, it needs to be properly sorted and placed in the correct bin.

Please do not put glass in the mixed container bin – it should be placed in the grey glass bin.

If you don't have a glass bin, you can pick one up for free at the Village Office.



PAPER AND FIBER PRODUCTS GO IN THE YELLOW PLASTIC BAG

Paper and fiber products, such as cardboard, newspapers, and magazines need to be separated from other recyclables. Please do not put paper or fiber products in the mixed blue container bin – they should be placed in the plastic bags provided for paper products.

It is important to note that cross-contamination of recycling streams can lead to entire batches of recycling being rejected and sent to the landfill. This defeats the purpose of recycling and harms the environment.

If you don't have a yellow bag, you can pick some up for free at the Village Office.

A **\$1,000** award is given annually from the trust fund to the applicant who best exemplifies the criteria described in the official terms of reference for the award.

TOMORROW IS GARBAGE DAY as well as food waste, garden waste and (clean) recycling. Time slots for pick-up and Works Yard drop-offs are unchanged.

Only food waste and garbage may be dropped off at the Works Yard, in this case you may leave clean recycling ONLY at the curb as you head out on Fridays.

Please freeze food waste before placing it in your green bin if at all possible and make sure the lids of your cans are well secured, bringing them in ASAP after they've been emptied.
